Justice Ming W. Chin became an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of California in March 1996 after his appointment by Governor Pete Wilson. He previously served as the Presiding Justice of the First District Court of Appeal, Division Three, in San Francisco.

Prior to serving on the appellate bench, Justice Chin was a judge of the Alameda County Superior Court. Before his appointment to the bench, Justice Chin was a partner in an Oakland law firm, where he specialized in business and commercial litigation.



Justice Joshua P. Groban began his term as an Associate Justice on the California Supreme Court in January 2019. Prior to taking the bench, Justice Groban served as the Senior Advisor to Governor Jerry Brown, advising the governor on judicial appointments, legal policy and legislative issues. Justice Groban received numerous awards from bar groups and other legal organizations for his work on judicial appointments. Justice Groban has taught State Appellate Practice at the UCLA School of Law. Prior to working for the governor's office, Justice Groban was a private practitioner, specializing in complex civil litigation, with a focus on antitrust, internal investigations, and intellectual property.
